FACTS

WHAT DOES COMBINED INSURANCE COMPANY OF AMERICA DO WITH YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?

Why?

Insurance companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal and state law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal and state law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.

What?

The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include:

- Social Security number and payment history
- insurance claim history and medical information
- account transactions and credit scores

When you are no longer our customer, we continue to share information about you as described in this notice.

How?

All insurance companies need to share customers' personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons insurance companies can share their customers' personal information; the reasons Combined chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

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What we do		
How does Combined protect my personal information?	To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings. We restrict access to personal information to our employees, affiliates', employees, or others who need to know that information to service the account or to conduct our normal business operations.	
How does Combined collect my personal information?	 We collect your personal information, for example, when you apply for insurance or pay insurance premiums file an insurance claim or provide account information give us your contact information We also collect your personal information from others, such as credit bureaus, affiliates or other companies. 	
Why can't I limit all sharing?	 Federal law gives you the right to limit only sharing for affiliates' everyday business purposes— information about your creditworthiness affiliates from using your information to market to you sharing for nonaffiliates to market to you State laws and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing. See below for more on your rights under state law. 	
What happens when I limit sharing for an account I hold jointly with someone else?	Your choices will apply to everyone on your policy.	
Definitions		
Affiliates	Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies. • Our affiliates include the Combined Life Insurance Company of New York, and other financial companies.	
Nonaffiliates	Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies. • Nonaffiliates we share with can include insurance companies and direct marketing companies.	
Joint marketing	A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you. Our joint marketing partners include categories of companies such as insurance companies.	

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Other important information

For Insurance Customers in AZ, CA, CT, GA, IL, MA, ME, MN, MT, NC, NJ, NV, OH, OR, and VA only: Under state law, you have the right to see the personal information about you that we have on file. To see your information, write Combined Insurance, Attention: Compliance Manager, P.O. Box 6705, Scranton, PA 18505-0705. Within 30 days of receipt of your written request, we will make any of this personal information available to you or to your designated representative. Combined may charge a reasonable fee to cover the costs of providing this information. You also have the right to request correction, amendment or deletion of any of this personal information. Within 30 business days of receipt of your written request, we will notify you of our correction, amendment or deletion of the information in dispute, or our refusal to make such correction, amendment or deletion after further investigation. In the event that we refuse to correct, amend or delete the information in dispute, you have the right to submit to us a written statement of the reasons for your disagreement with our assessment of the information in dispute and what you consider to be the correct information. We shall make such a statement accessible to any and all parties reviewing the information in dispute. We may also disclose personal information about you without your permission to an insurance regulatory authority, or law enforcement, or other governmental authority to the extent permitted or required by law. Information obtained from a report prepared by an insurance-support organization may be retained by the insurance-support organization and disclosed to other persons.

For California Residents Only: Your state law requires financial institutions to obtain your consent under certain circumstances prior to sharing information about you with non-affiliated third parties while you are a resident of California. We may disclose information about you as permitted by applicable law, including where required, with your consent. Under state law, under certain circumstances, you also have the right to correct, amend, or delete the personal information about you that we have on file by writing to Combined Insurance, Attention: Compliance Manager, P.O. Box 6705, Scranton, PA 18505-0705. We will respond to your request within 30 business days.

For Massachusetts Residents Only: In the event that coverage for which you have applied is declined, terminated for reasons other than failure to pay your premium, or offered to you at a higher than standard rate, you have the right to request in writing within 90 days the specific reasons why. Within 21 days of receipt of your written request, we will submit to you a written statement of the specific reasons for our decision and the specific items in your recorded personal information that support that decision.

For Nevada Residents Only: We may contact our existing customers by telephone to offer additional insurance products that we believe may be of interest to you. Under state law, you have the right to opt out of these calls by adding your name to our internal do-not-call list. To opt out of these calls, or for more information about your opt out rights, please contact our customer service department. You are being provided this notice under Nevada state law.
